RE: Annual Health Assessment and Immunization Compliance Reporting

All North Carolina public and public charter schools are required annually to report on the status of Health Assessments for those students who are enrolling for the first time in a North Carolina public or public charter school (§ 130A-441(c)), and the immunization status of all students in kindergarten, seventh grade, and twelfth grade (G.S. 130A-155(c)). Student attending in-person, remote learning or home-schooled are required to be compliant with regulations within 30 calendar days of the first day of attendance. Reporting is mandated within 60 calendar days after commencement of the new school year. As a result, compliance reports are due no later than November 1, 2021, but may be completed at any time prior to that date and are now open.
